1. Introductions and Apologies for Absence:

2. Confirmation of minutes from previous meeting

NN: Has everyone received the minutes from the last session? Just confirming?

AS: So, I have received mine, but I was not able to attend the last session and I passed a message to I don't remember who and the topic was about tickets for graduation, but I don't know if that was discussed or not.

NN: I'm now part of a committee teaching for excellence, I can arrange to have a conversation and I can involve you as well in it, or I can involve everyone and we can see what we can do.

AS: I think involving everyone will be more beneficial because we are all students and we all have our own opinion about that

NN: I'll take action on that and drop them an email and let everyone know what is said.

3. Education 2030

NN: I'll give a quick update on ED2030, I attended the last AB there were some issues that were raised by some Course Reps. Mature students were feeling left out so I spoke to the deputy vice chancellor Andy Collop to have a conversation with those students and to discuss how their teaching will be impacted. I also made it clear that Instructions from the university must be clear that the new style of teaching won't affect the current students, and there is also a conversation about personal tutors. Whether they're needed or not so I would like to get feedback from you and what you think about that for the next meeting I go to. There will also a be a committee about how the support the student union provides once 2030 is in place, I don't' know if anyone has any comments or feedback they would like to share?

4. DSU Awareness campaign

NN: Okay, I have a project I've started working on it's a DSU awareness campaign, I'm working with the Voice team, involving Course Reps too and everyone in the zone too, we've printed some merchandise and bought some freebies and we're in contact with university staff too and we want to create a video too, explaining what the teams do, voice team, advice. The video will be in different university buildings and we're going to do shout outs, and host stalls to raise awareness of student union and what it's about, anyone who wants to be part of it is welcome.

NN: Questions, suggestions?

AS: Okay, you said that the project will involve a video, is that an interview what will it include?

NN: Okay, it's more like a staff member from the Voice team will introduce voice and what that entails, e.g. we support Course Reps and stuff like that, a member of the Opportunities team talking about volunteering, societies, a Commercial staff member talking about Injunction etc. It will be staff members talking about their role in DSU so students know what to look for when they come to DSU.

AS: How can council reps be involved in that project?

NN: Under voice, when we're at the stalls and when we do the lecture shout outs you can help out there, but it's also ideas from you guys about what we can include in the project?

AS: Okay sounds interesting, when are you planning to do the preparations and start the shooting?

NN: I've started the script for the video and the lecture shout outs, and that merchandise has been purchased. So, I would say from next week most of the things will start running, and will I keep everyone here updated and work out everyone's availability so we can do the work together. Thanks, for the contribution Anna.

NN: Is there anything that you guys have to say or share, that we should pay particular attention to? Just hearing from the zone members.

NN: Toby?



TS: I'm assuming the lectures are going to be for 1st and 2nd years, because the 3rd years already know

NN: 1st, 2nd years but there's some 3rd years lecture shout outs booked too. We just want to make sure we don't leave anyone out, so the lecture shut outs will be for all year groups as there are still some people who don't know about DSU.

AS: I want to ask about something that I've already discussed with Hussain on Friday, I've heard that 3rd year students will have extra access to Avalon studios. Due to covid we haven't had access, I've heard this is just a rumour. This is something that's really important, for all students. They still believe that they will have access afterwards, when will only have it until the end of the course. What about those students who will go for extensions or deferrals? Do they get a new card? I know this is very hard, and I know 1-year access to studios and Avalon will be hard to figure out I think in the summertime teachers could do extra labs with students to get extra information they have missed. I'm in the process of writing an email to Hussain.

NN: You said you'll be writing an email to Hussain when it comes through that will be picked up and we'll figure out who to speak to in the university.

HM: We spoke about it on Friday when we had that CEM meeting, and once we receive that information, we will make sure it goes to the correct person at the university and will Teach out to Pamela for support to

SG: Sounds good, the course reps aren't well known in BAL at least and most don't get any student feedback so it definitely needs more awareness.

NN: When do you think would be the best time to do it? April? May?

TS: End of April, early May I have a dissertation due in late April

AS: Early May

NN: Stephanie, what do you think?

SG: Yeah early May, sounds about right

NN: So, I think early May could work, maybe the first week. And then we can see how to send the information out there, and look at the numbers. Alright cool, we'll definitely follow up on this and put action to it, and how to real put the message across of everything you have all mentioned.

We have so many activities for stress awareness and mental health within the DSU, so definitely direct them to the DSU where they can book a one to one session.

AS: In terms of mental health awareness week, I'm running every two weeks a programme about mental health awareness on Demon FM, I was wondering if anyone would like to join me for our talk to find out what DMU/DSU are doing. and discuss the events and support available so the students know what's going on. I will later submit it as a podcast so we can refer back.

NN: Yeah, I'm sure definitely some of us would like to join and support, if you tell us when your programme is someone can come, even I could.

AS: Yeah, that great. That's brilliant, would be nice. I will definitely email.

NN: Or maybe another, member of staff from advice too.



MK: Yeah, definitely email us. The stress awareness events are a collaborative effort from different teams in DSU. There will be events hosted by Voice, Advice, yeah email someone and we'll try and get one of the execs or someone from one of the other teams hosting events to come along and talk about it.
