

The SRACon was the biggest event in Demon Media's recent history. We saw 454 student media fans from all over the UK decend upon DMU for three days to have an informative, fun-filled time. Special guests included Greg James, Ben Cooper and Steve Parkinson.





Course Rep Conference

This was one of the most successful conferences for Course Reps that we've held. With an array of presentations from various departments in both the SU and the University, the conference meant that new course reps could meet and chat with other Reps and University staff too, and find out about new developments on campus. 80 Reps attended!

Toys on the Table

DSU became Santa! We broke our record for number of Toys donated for Toys on the Table by receiving over 350 toys from students and staff. We followed up the campaign with The Big Wrap where volunteers helped to wrap the presents and they were then distributed to children in the local area who wouldn't otherwise have received anything.

DSU's Welfare and Education Centre gave students the opportunity to share various money-saving tips via Facebook and Twitter with fellow students. The best tips received a fresh fruit basket!

1100 students attended the event throughout the year.

Anonymous marking is a project that has been 5 years in the making, and this year, Deputy President Education, Caitlin, has managed to get it passed as University policy. This means that your work will be marked anonymously by your tutors, making marking free from positive or negative bias. A big win for equality and diversity!

DSU's Fuse Mentoring service secured funding from Leicestershire County Council, meaning there's now 25 opportunities for students to become mentors.





The event was extended and it provided societies & sports teams with an extra chance to showcase what they do to encourage more of you to get involved. Next year, we'll receive a record breaking £1M block grant from the University. This has been achieved through extensive lobbying and a consistent effort to raise the profile of DSU.


This extra money will enable us to continue to improve our services to make your student experience better!

DSU ELECTIONS 2013

The DSU Elections are a key event in the student calendar. In the main elections in February, over 2,500 students had their say by voting and it is the first year in which all 5 Executive Officers were elected at the first stage.

LOOKING AHEAD

We want to make sure that every DMU student knows that they are automatically a member of DSU and they are eligible to take part in all of DSU's Elections. The Big Meet, DSU's Annual General Meeting, was held in December 2012 and was the best attended in years, with 60 students taking part. Various topics were discussed including revisions to the constitution and lapsing policies.

DSU LOOKS AFTER YOUR WELLBEING & EDUCATION

DSU's Welfare and Education Centre (WEC) is like "the parent away from home" for some students.

Although rare, sometimes things go wrong while at University and students just need somewhere to turn for support or advice. This is where the Welfare and Education Centre helps.

The WEC is completely impartial and free to use and it's open all year round. They help a wide variety of students from those accused of academic misconduct, to international students needing help with visas, and students who have problems with their landlords in housing too.

Here's what users of the WEC have to say!

"Thank you for all your help and for all your support. I can't not tell you how much weight this has lifted off my shoulders!" "I'd like to say a really big big thank you to you. You have no idea how big a help you've been. Before meeting you I'd rang many places but they weren't helpful at all" "Words cannot describe how grateful I am. I appreciate your time and help"

"You are a star! Thank you so much for all of your help. I couldn't have done it without you and it means so much to me"



We have distributed over 2,500 condoms at DSU's SECS Clinic since October 2012 and more of students know about the clinic and its services than before! The SECS Clinic has a drop in every Thursday from 10am. This year, students will have saved an astonishing £225,604 by using the WEC service!





303 students have used the WEC drop in service so far this year!

So far for 2012/13, the overall number of enquiries we've had at the WEC are 4954.





Student Visa applications submitted via the WEC are up by 30% on last years figures.

Student Case Study: WEC

"Sarah*" originally sought the WEC's help at the start of her studies at DMU. At the time she was living in a refuge hostel following an abusive relationship she had been in. Due to her benefits being cut when she became a full time student, she was asked to leave the hostel as she was not in a position to financially support herself.

We helped Sarah to apply for student funding through Student Finance England. Once her student funding had been approved, we provided housing support in order for Sarah to secure a more permanent residence. We gave her housing hunting advice and checked her contract before she signed.

We also signposted her to supportive counselling services to assist her to deal with the abusive situation she had experienced. During the following years, Sarah unfortunately lost both her parents and during this emotional period, we assisted in securing extensions and deferrals for exams and coursework.


Most recently, the student encountered problems of an academic nature. She asked us for help when her faculty requested that she meet with them regarding two potential academic offences. We advised, assisted and represented her through two Academic Practice Offence meetings and also an Academic Offences Panel Hearing where we were successful in assisting her to remain on her course until its completion.

The WEC have supported Sarah through advice and representation during her entire time at DMU and with that help, she is scheduled to complete her course in the next few months.




WE UNDERSTAND OUR STAFF AND THEIR NEEDS


